Topclass Manufacturing Limited ("the company") was placed into liquidation by a special resolution; og 303 0508 of the shareholders pursuant to Section 241(2)(a) of the Companies Act 1993 ("the Act") on 9 conz February 2017. Peri Micaela Finnigan and Boris van Delden, CAANZ Accredited Insolvencyww.mvp.co.nz Practitioners, of Auckland, were appointed as joint and several liquidators of the company.

The director advised that the company manufactured and installed commercial fit-outs and kitchens. The director further advised that the company catered for a separate market from related company, Topclass Kitchens Limited, and had slightly different shareholdings. The company began trading in early 2016, based on prospects anticipated by former director and shareholder, Nigel Pither. The company failed to secure and complete sufficient work needed to trade successfully, and ceased operations in August 2016.

The company's most significant asset when it ceased trading was an intercompany loan to Topclass Kitchens Limited. Shortly after the latter was placed in liquidation, it became apparent that recovery of the intercompany debt was unlikely, and the shareholders resolved to place the company in liquidation.

5 STATEMENT OF AFFAIRS

A Statement of Affairs showing the company's estimated financial position as at the date of our appointment is provided at Appendix 1.

6 ASSETS AND PROPOSALS FOR CONDUCTING THE LIQUIDATION

The company had no stock or work in progress at the date of liquidation. It's only physical asset was an item of office equipment. The company's records showed accounts receivable of \$14,513.95, however our investigations have revealed this amount to be in respect of invoices prematurely prepared, as the company had not completed the work invoiced. The company's sole significant asset was an intercompany loan to Topclass Kitchens Limited, which itself was placed in liquidation on 23 January 2017.

We will complete a thorough review of the company's books, records and affairs to:

- ensure that all assets have been properly accounted for,
- determine if there are any other avenues of recovery for creditors,
- determine if the company's officers have properly carried out their duties, and take appropriate steps where necessary.

If there are funds available for distribution to creditors we will verify creditors' claims and make a distribution. We will then complete the liquidation and request that the Registrar of Companies remove the company from the register.



7 LIABILITIES AND CREDITOR CLAIMS

7.1 Secured Creditors

At the date of liquidation three secured parties had registered security interests against the company on the Personal Property Securities Register.

- Sopers Macindoe & Banks LP over goods supplied
- Herman Pacific Limited over goods supplied
- Maxillam Limited over goods supplied.

Personal Property Securities Act / Reservation of Title

Should any creditor believe that they are entitled to any goods, or proceeds from realisation of goods, due to holding a Purchase Money Security Interest, they should contact us immediately.

If any creditor believes that they have a Reservation of Title over goods and they have not perfected their interest, they should also contact us immediately.

7.2 Preferential Creditors

At this stage in our investigations, we are unaware of any unpaid wages, holiday pay or redundancy pay owing to former employees.

The Inland Revenue Department has not yet provided us with a creditor's claim form but we understand that there are amounts due in respect of GST, PAYE and other payroll deductions. The Inland Revenue Department is the company's only known creditor.

7.3 Unsecured Creditors

From our review of the company's accounting records and other information we estimate that there are no amounts due to unsecured creditors.

A schedule of known creditors and their addresses is provided at Appendix 2, as required by Section 255(2)(c) of the Act.

A notice to creditors to prove debts or claims is included at Appendix 4. Also enclosed is a creditor's claim form for completion and return to this office by Friday, 24 March 2017. Creditors that have not made a claim by the date on the notice may be excluded from any distribution made. If you believe that you are a secured creditor, please contact us and the appropriate form will be sent to you.

8 CREDITORS' MEETING / LIQUIDATION COMMITTEE

A notice of the Liquidators' decision to dispense with the meeting of creditors is provided at Appendix 3.



Pursuant to Section 314 of the Companies Act 1993, creditors are advised that at any time during the course of the liquidation the Liquidator shall, at the request in writing of any creditor or shareholder, call a meeting for the purpose of appointing a liquidation committee.
